

## School Visit Fact Sheet

### School session details

The Story Museum's 'Changing Room' is open for a 'Dressed For Stories' 90 minute session (£100 + VAT) or a Wonder Walk and dressing up session (£160 + VAT).

School visits take place on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays subject to availability.

The morning session is 10am to 12 noon.  
The afternoon session is 12.30pm to 2.30pm.

Each time slot can accommodate 1 group: maximum 35 participants with accompanying staff and adults/pupils in the appropriate ratio (1:6 for KS1 and KS2 or 1:10 for KS3).

Each bookable session has a specific focus. When booking please ensure you state the age range of your group and the session name as specified on the Story Museum website. You can specify an emphasis for your chosen session.

Each group will be allocated a member of the Learning and Participation team for the duration of their visit. They will lead your session and should you have any queries on the day, they should be able to provide you with assistance.

### Lunch Facilities

Groups may book a space in which to eat lunch. This must be requested at the point of booking.

Lunch spaces are bookable for 30 minutes after a morning session or 30 minutes prior to an afternoon session. Groups without a pre-booked lunch space will be required to leave the museum at the end of their session.

### The Story Museum Shop

Please let us know at the time of booking if your students would like to visit the shop. We ask that students do so in groups of no more than 6 and that they are supervised by an adult at all times. Groups are also requested to go to the shop at the end of their visit.

### Making a booking

- number of goody bags required and/or intention to visit the shop
- any special requirements

We cannot guarantee to accommodate all requests but we will work with the group leader to try to facilitate any necessary changes with the least possible disruption to either the group's or museum's schedule.

### **Arriving at the Museum**

There is **NO** parking or vehicle access available at the Story Museum.

If you are travelling by public transport the nearest bus stops are on St Aldates but all the City Centre stops are within a 10 minute walk of the museum.

We are approximately a 15 minute walk from Oxford railway station, OX1 1HS.

On arrival at the Story Museum you will be greeted by a member of the Story Museum Team.

Groups with a morning booking should plan to arrive at the Story Museum 15 minutes prior to the session. If you have a pre-booked lunch space please do not arrive more than 10 minutes before your allocated slot, as due to the restricted space within the Museum we are unable to accommodate groups outside these times.

### **Fire & Evacuation Procedures**

At the start of your visit, your group will be given a 'house-keeping' briefing regarding the access in and around the building and the Museum evacuation procedure.

A loud two-tone continuous alarm will be used to alert staff and visitors of the need to evacuate the building.

Group leaders and accompanying adults should gather with their groups in courtyard where a member of the Story Museum team will direct them to the muster point in Pembroke Street. At the assembly point teachers should take their register and report any missing persons to the Duty Manager.

### **Toilet Facilities**

Two accessible toilets are situated on the ground floor across the courtyard. All children should be accompanied by an adult.

### **Leaving the Museum**

On leaving the Museum, groups are requested to check that they have all their personal belongings with them.

Due to the demand for access to and the nature of the exhibition space, groups cannot be accommodated in the Museum after their allocated/booked session time.
